FROM THE



RECTOR

Lent is a season when we are called to deepen our focus on God. We follow our Savior into the wilderness for forty days, turning to God in prayer and removing distraction.

That's what the traditional practices of self-denial are all about.

But we all know that not eating chocolate – or even not eating meat – does not automatically make us turn to God. We need to be intentional about it.

The great English Anglican spiritual writer, Evelyn Underhill, once wrote, “You don't have to be peculiar to find God, but you do have to make a willed commitment to make Him the center of your life, all aspects of it!”

Underhill took her own advice. Born in 1875, she grew up in a household that had no particular interest in religion; she, however, always had a spiritual bent, and became a Christian in 1907. She spent a great deal of time writing about faith, offering spiritual guidance, and visiting those in need, and in 1924, she began to lead retreats.

Yet she was not removed from ordinary life. Her faith was grounded in Christ and his incarnation: if Christ became human, then every part of life is sacred. Yes, she spent a great deal of time in prayer, but she also managed a household, enjoyed sailing, was interested in woodwork and metalwork, and during World War I, worked in naval intelligence! And in everything she did, she paid attention to where God might be found. In fact, it was that careful attention that led her to become a pacifist later in life.

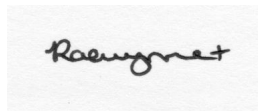


Underhill's great passion was to help people connect with God. In *Practical Mysticism: A Book for Normal People*, she wrote: “Eternity is with us, inviting our contemplation perpetually, but we are too frightened, lazy, and suspicious to respond; too arrogant to still our thought, and let divine sensation have its way. It needs industry and goodwill if we would make that

transition; for the process involves a veritable spring-cleaning of the soul, a turning-out and rearrangement of our mental furniture, a wide opening of closed windows, that the notes of the wild birds beyond our garden may come to us fully charged with wonder and freshness, and drown with their music the noise of the gramophone within. Those who do this, discover that they have lived in a stuffy world, whilst their inheritance was a world of morning-glory: where every tit-mouse is a celestial messenger, and every thrusting bud is charged with the full significance of life.”

This Lent, take time for God. Put aside a few minutes each day to read the bible and to pray, and then, as you move through the day, look for Christ around you. You may be amazed by what you discover.

Scott Gunn, the Executive Director for *Forward Day by Day* suggests that for this season of Lent we might try a more traditional approach to practicing what has become our Lenten discipline of deprivation. What if, he writes, instead of giving up chocolate or initiating a more stringent diet, we were to embrace Lent as a voyage of repentance, acknowledging our sins and trying “to grow more deeply into the full stature of Christ?”

After all, as Gunn points out, Lent provides an opportunity to turn away from temptations of a more spiritual rather than corporal nature. We can take this time to focus our attention on trying to walk our Lord's path more humbly and devotedly.

Because Lambeth House sits on a bend in the Mississippi River, we could see fireworks continuously up and down the river for 180 degrees. It was quite amazing!

We have ventured out to a grocery store and hope to find another one today (Jan. 4). I have studied the map but the roads are a bit crazy with some following the bends in the river.
