As you will have heard or read, the time has come for me to move on from St James to a new ministry. It's always hard to leave the people and place you have loved and served over many years, but God's call can't be ignored.

We are now entering into a time of transition. I thought it might be helpful to outline the stages of that transition for you.

Saying goodbye

No one likes to say goodbye, but it's such an important time. For the next three months, that will be our focus.

Some of this will be practical, passing on responsibilities for various ministries and making notes on how we do things.

But more important will be the personal goodbyes. I hope to have a chance to spend time with you all informally, so we can say our goodbyes. When I first came to St James, I had a sign up sheet to have a meal or coffee with parishioners. It seems like a good idea to do the same now - so please sign up at the back of the church!

Nothing will be done about a search for a new priest until after I have left (that's a standard rule in the Episcopal Church).

Discernment

The wardens and vestry will meet with the Diocese's new transition minister, the Rev. Clair Woodley, some time in the next couple of months. She will guide the parish through the discernment process, which will begin in the new year.

There are a couple of options for a new priest. One is the traditional search, which can take up to two years; during this time there would be an interim priest. The other is to call a priest-in-charge, where the wardens and vestry can request that the bishop provide one or more candidates who would be a good fit for our parish. There is a simplified interview process, and the chosen candidate is appointed for one to three years. After two years, the priest-in-charge may be invited by the parish to formally become the rector.

Welcoming a new priest!

This time ahead of us will be hard, but holy, as we remember what God has done among us, and pray for God's blessing in the years ahead.
