It's the beginning of the new school year, and the stores are full of parents and children shopping for backpacks,

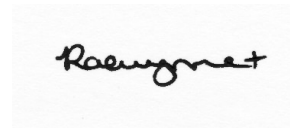

Fall brings changes at church as well. In our 9:30 a.m. service we switch back from Eucharistic Prayer C to Prayer A; we return to the normal scheduling of hymns. The choir returns and Sunday schools starts up again. 8 a.m. goes on as usual! Bible studies will be starting up; our regular cycle of meetings begins again.

On Sunday, September 12, we celebrate the beginning of the new program year with a Ministry Fair at coffee hour after the 9:30 a.m. service. GETTING EXCITED ABOUT GROWING IN FAITH

Saturday, August 28th saw 13 members of our parish gather at Little Portion Friary in Mount Sinai for a retreat. The Friary is a place seemingly steeped in holiness. You just feel closer to God when you are there. It was a day of fellowship, fun, and reflection.

At the conclusion of our retreat, we were asked to write down in our new journals thoughts about two words. The first word was “excite.” Checking the dictionary - “Excite - to put into motion or activity; To call forth, provoke, to arouse feelings, or passion.” It did not seem to be a difficult task, although you could see many of us looking around to see what others were doing. We discovered that we shared many of the same answers: being with friends, a beautiful day, sunsets, walking on the beach, to name a few. We found that we both have a real passion for celebrating God’s creation.

The second word was “faith.” While trying to describe what excites us was a cause for pause, writing down our thoughts about “faith” truly left most of us, well, lost. Ironically, as I struggled to put into words what faith means to me, I wrote down, “comfort, never being alone.” Later that evening while reading a book Raewynne had given me, I came across the following from Jeremiah (17:7-8). *“But blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD, whose confidence is in him. He will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when the heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit.”* I found myself becoming excited. Excited by the prospect that while I face many struggles, God does dare for me. I certainly wanted to grow in that faith and be comforted.

CHRISTIAN FORMATION & EDUCATION

Fall Bible Studies: Grow in Scripture and Deepen Relationships. Fall is here! And with it comes the opportunity to sign up for a Fall Bible Study that fits your schedule. In sync with the Sunday lectionary readings for the coming months, we will study the New Testament letters that the Apostle Paul wrote to Timothy. *Absolutely no previous experience in Bible study is required!* Groups will meet weekly throughout the fall, beginning the week of September 19. Sessions generally last about 1-1/2 hours. Not only do we read and study scripture together, but it’s a great way to make new friends, deepen existing friendships, and pray together. You won’t regret taking this step of faith. In addition to reading the actual letters of I and II Timothy, we will be referring to N.T. Wright’s *Paul for Everyone: The Pastoral Letters of 1 and 2 Timothy and Titus*. If you’d like a copy – whether or not you’ll be participating in a Fall Bible Study – we’ll have them available for \$10 each at the September 12 Ministry Fair.

On Retreat. Finally, this past Saturday, August 28, an intergenerational group of 13 parishioners – including 5 current Sunday school teachers – met at Little Portion Friary for a half day retreat. We shared the Eucharist with the Friary Brothers, had lunch together, and then spent a couple hours in reading and discussion two passages of Scripture, silent reflection, and some fun activities. The overall focus of “Stepping Out of the Boat: Getting Excited About Growing in Faith” caused us to reflect that no matter where we are in our faith journey, God is with us. The following blessing says it well:

A toe in the water?

May the streams of the Spirit refresh you.

Up to your ankles?

May the currents of God caress you.

Over your knees?

*May the waves of Christ-confidence
surround you.*

Out of your depth?

*May oceans of Grace uphold and embrace
you.*
